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

Our local pickleball player, John Gill, is pitching to take the up-and-coming sport of PICKLEBALL from his start in Seal Beach to the Olympics in Australia in 2032. John moved permanently to America in January 2020 with his wife, Victoria. He was about to teach Hapkido and Taekwondo at the Beverly Hills karate academy. Then Covid hit, and indoor sports were no longer available. So a friend, Bobby Frederick, introduced John to Pickleball in March 2020, and after 43 years of tennis, he was instantly hooked. John said, "Pickleball is so much fun, great exercise, extremely social, and usually outdoors! "

John's first time playing Pickleball was at our Seal Beach Tennis and Pickleball Center. He was also the first to play with Mike Wooten on our Marina Park courts when they opened. The Seal Beach community witnessed his introduction to Pickleball, which quickly became a lifelong passion. John played nonstop for the next few years and is committed to spreading the sport's joy, exercise benefits, and camaraderie. As the founder of the World Pickleball Association LLC, John has successfully organized 14 tournaments over the last year and a half – eight of them have been in Southern California.

Our Marina Park regulars, Ted Chen and Kelly Woodrum, won the recent Los Angeles Championships - Mixed Doubles Division on May 14 in neighboring Long Beach.

John is also a certified Pickleball instructor with PPR and IPTPA. He is pushing to bring his events overseas, particularly to Australia, and working hard to get Pickleball as an Olympic sport by the 2032 Australian Games. In addition to being a passionate Pickleball advocate, John serves as an ambassador for DUPR (Dynamic Universal Pickleball Rating), offering beginner-friendly tournaments called "Pickle N Pizza." These inclusive, community-oriented events aim to draw newcomers into the sport, providing a fun, friendly, and delicious introduction to the game. John is also a world-renowned World Martial arts champion (8th Dan-Bo Blackbelt in Hapkido and 7th Dan Blackbelt in Taekwondo), Australian Tennis Champion, and more recently, a Pickleball Champion, winning many medals in tournaments since 2020. He has played



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in almost 200 tournament matches over the last two years. John Gill, better known as "Aussie John, "has a dream and a drive to bring Pickleball to the global stage of the 2032 Olympics in his home country, Australia.

John's efforts extend beyond Pickleball and into social activism. He founded the non-profit organization SAFE Foundation, which aims to combat violence and homelessness. The foundation's ambitious goal is to establish a Health and Sports resort between Seal Beach and Las Vegas for the homeless and vulnerable, offering self-defense training and Pickleball sessions. The SAFE Foundation reflects its commitment to making a tangible difference by providing empowering and constructive solutions. John is in discussion with our local authorities to offer his SAFE seminars to the residents of Seal Beach. These seminars focus on self-protection, anti-bullying, fitness, and empowerment to enhance the overall well-being of our community. www. usaschoolofselfdefense.com

John has many more local, US, and international tourneys to bolster his

Olympics resume for consideration by the International Olympic Committee (IOC). He is also organizing a pickleball tour to Australia slated for December 28, 2023, to January 20, 2024, featuring the No.1 senior Pro in the world, Dave Weinbach. This tour includes pickleball clinics and playing sessions, culminating in a five-day visit to Melbourne to watch tennis at the Australian Open. 
